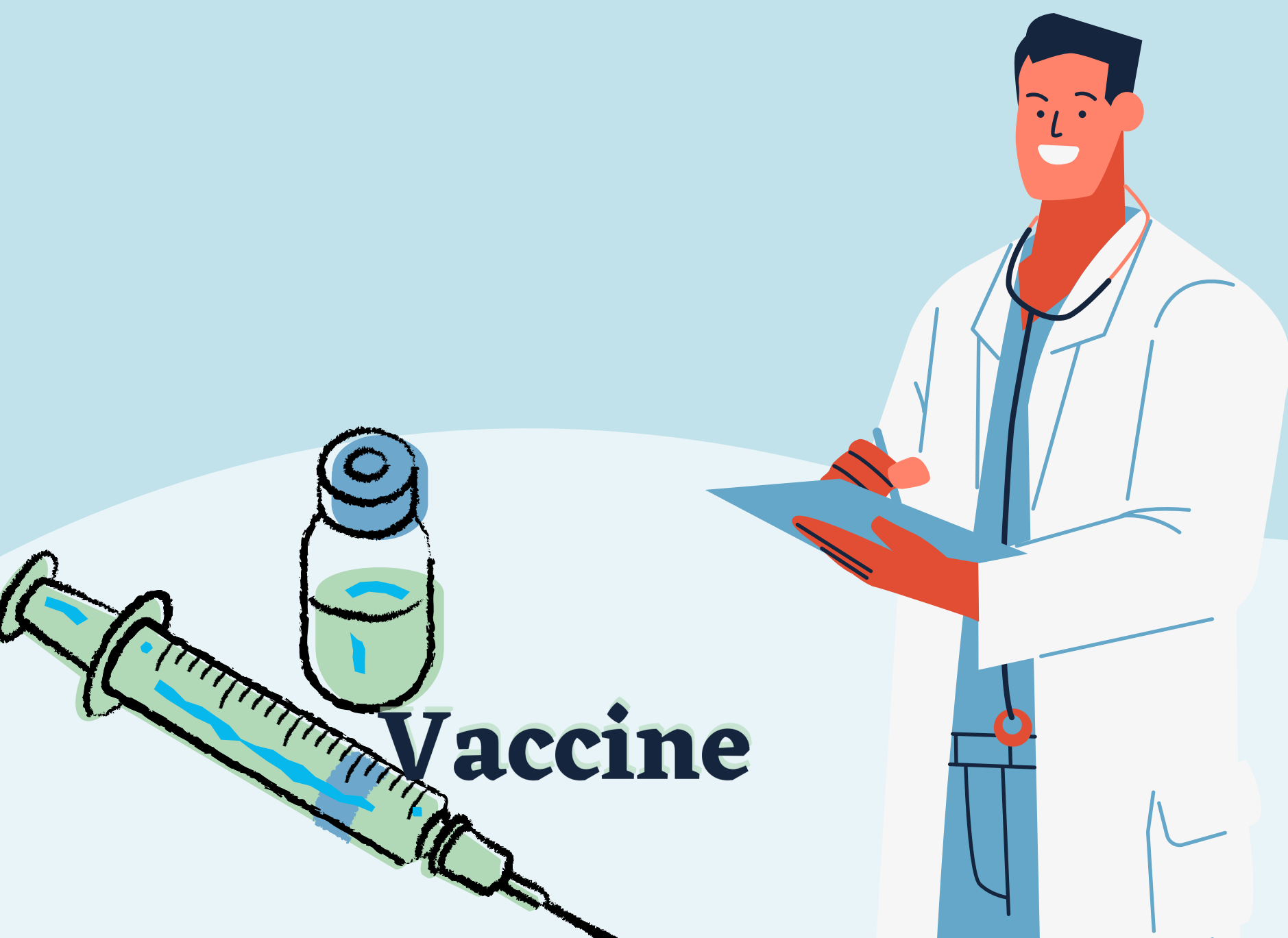


Getting the Covid-19 vaccine appointment



Starting April 6, 2021 New York State residents 16 years old or more can get the Covid-19 vaccine.

Proof of Residency in New York State

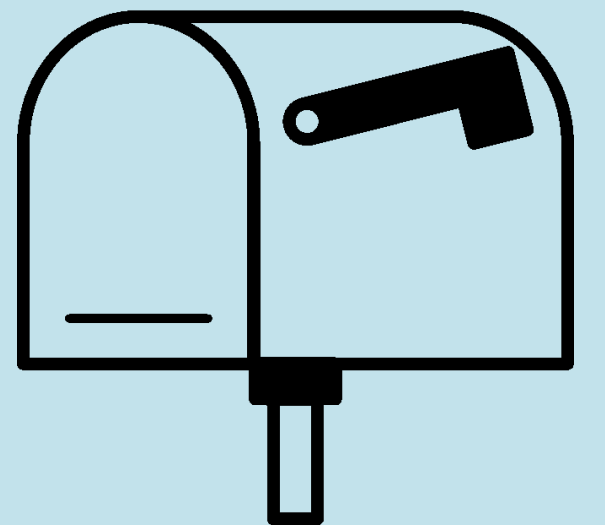
Choose one

- State or government-issued ID
- Statement from landlord
- Current rent receipt or lease
- Mortgage records

or

Choose two

- Statement from another person
- Current mail
- School records



Some vaccination sites may also require proof of NYC residency or residency within certain ZIP codes.

Remember!

- Vaccinations are **free** for all.
- Insurance is not needed
- You will not be asked for a social security number
- You will never be asked to put a deposit down or give credit card information to make a vaccination appointment in New York City.
- New Yorkers can report fraud by calling 833-VAX-SCAM (833-829-7226) toll-free or emailing the state Department of Health at STOPVAXFRAUD@health.ny.gov

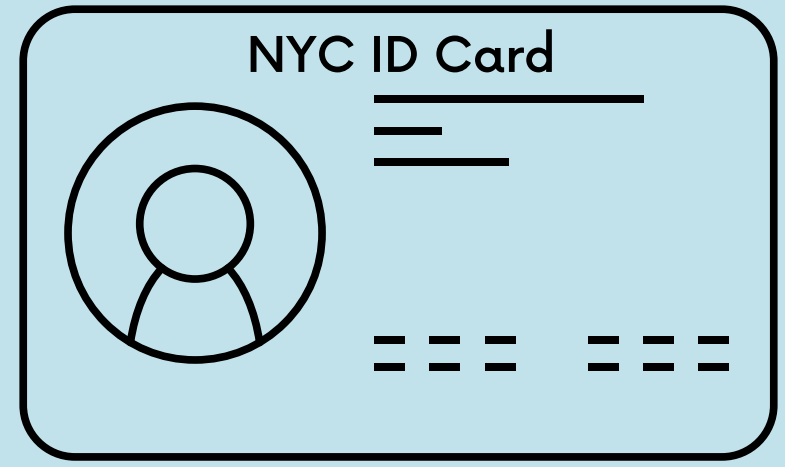

Proof of Age

May include:

- Driver's license or non-driver ID
- IDNYC
- Birth certificate issued by a state or local government
- Current U.S passport or valid foreign passport
- Permanent resident card
- Certificate of Naturalization or Citizenship
- Life insurance policy with birthdate
- Marriage certificate with birth date



The purpose of these documents is to confirm your eligibility for vaccination. They will not be collected or copied by people working at vaccination sites.
